These electives should be in social studies, science, math, English and language arts, arts and humanities, and foreign language and be above the introductory level in agriculture, industrial technology, business, marketing, family and consumer sciences, health sciences and technology education, and career pathways. Electives in physical education and health are limited to one-half credit each.
