## Like to Travel? Go in Flannel! – THIS Sat., Jan 24, 9:00 am

The Blue Flannel Club, the NKU field trip club associated with the Honors Program, will be taking a trip to the National Museum of the Air Force in Dayton on Saturday, January 24th. Highlights of this trip will be *Endeavor*, the Apollo 15 Command Module (as we all know, Apollo 15 was the first space mission in history where pure science was the primary mission goal), the collection of Air Force One planes (including the plane made famous as the location of the swearing in of President Lyndon B. Johnson), one of only two surviving X-15 rocket planes, and Tacit Blue, a top secret research plane that may have been responsible for many UFO sightings over the Nevada desert. This museum also houses a collection of Holocaust artifacts, including one of the few remaining gray-striped prisoner uniforms, and tells the story of a number of local Holocaust survivors. And don't forget about the wonderful examples of WWII nose art and probably the largest camera you will ever see.

We will be carpooling and will depart NKU Saturday morning at 9 a.m. and return in the late afternoon or early evening. Admission to the museum is free, though access to the Presidential
