The intent of the document is to provide a consistent reference base for faculty and staff in their development of programs and activities at the University. The document also serves as a historical record of the University’s enrollment, programs and staffing.

The data on students and academic programs reflect the status of the University at census dates used in reporting to the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education. Nonetheless, there are differences between some of the data herein and data reported to the Council by the University. Such differences are noted. Data related to faculty and staff reflect status on census dates used for reports to the National Center for Education Statistics.

When programs and disciplines change affiliation from one department or college to another, the MIR reflects the organizational realignment. The data reflect the organizational structure in place at the start of the most recent term in the reports.

The intent of this document is to provide an active resource for the various offices of the University. The Office of Institutional Research welcomes comments and suggestions which can enhance the usefulness of the “Management Information Reports”.
