The Spring, 2004 MIR has been posted on the Office of Institutional Research web page, nku.edu/~oir/mir.html. The Adobe Acrobat Reader that is required for viewing the document will let you go directly to pages from each section's indexed listing. If you do not have the current version of the Reader, click on the yellow Adobe icon on the MIR screen. You can download the free Reader software to your Windows or MAC p.c. In addition to viewing pages and charts through a "point and click" content listing for each section, you can print out entire sections or selected pages. Contact User Services if you need assistance with using the reader.

Beginning with the Fall 2003 MIR, we will provide only a few printed copies as a cost saving measure. The MIR will be posted on the Office of Institutional Research (~oir) web page. The web version is actually easier to use, since we provide a point-and-click table of contents. You can also find data quickly through the pdf search procedure.

The "Management Information Reports" is a compendium of statistical data which profile Northern Kentucky University. The intent of the document is to provide a consistent reference base for faculty and staff in their development of programs and activities at the University. The document also serves as a historical record of the University's enrollment, programs, and staffing.

The data on students and academic programs reflect the status of the University at census dates used in reporting to the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education. Nonetheless, there are differences between some of the data herein and data reported to the Council by the University. Such differences are noted.

When programs and disciplines change affiliation from one department or college to another, the MIR reflects the organizational realignment. The data reflect the organizational structure in place at the start of the most recent term in the reports.

The intent of this document is to provide an active resource for the various offices of the University. Its availability on the University's web site provides broader public information and the expanded availability of data for research purposes. The Office of Institutional Research welcomes comments and suggestions which can enhance the usefulness of the "Management Information Reports."
