 \*\*\*\*Students may only apply one foreign language course in fulfillment of the Culture and Creativity category.  
 +Communication and Math areas should be completed before 45 semester hours are earned.

## General Education FAQs

1. Can one course be used for multiple categories?
  - No double dipping – cannot use same course to satisfy two categories. (i.e. SOC 101 can not be used to complete Cultural Pluralism and Global Viewpoints areas)
2. Can I take two courses from the same discipline to satisfy a category requiring multiple classes?
  - No. Only 1 discipline can be taken per category:  
Self & Society Category is comprised of Cultural Pluralism and Individual & Society.  
A student could only take 1 ANT and 1 SOC course in those two groups.  
  
A student must use two different disciplines in the Natural Science, Culture and Creativity and Individual & Society categories.
    - Natural Science: **cannot** use 2 AST, 2 BIO, 2 CHE, 2 ENV, 2 GLY, or 2 PHY
    - Cultural and Creativity: **cannot** use 2 HIS, 2 ENG, 2 TAR, or 2 POP
    - Individual & Society: **cannot** use 2 ANT, 2 ECO, or 2 PSC
3. How many foreign languages can I use?
  - Can only use 1 Foreign Language course in the Culture and Creativity category.
4. How long do I have to complete ENG 101?
  - ENG 101 should be completed by the time the student earns 30 credit hours.
5. How long do I have to complete my Math and Communication Requirements?
  - Communication and Math requirements should be completed by the time the student earns 45 credit hours.
6. When should I complete Written II?
  - Most of the courses for Written II require at least SO standing (30 credit hours) and the content writing courses may have other pre-reqs.
7. What if I have academic deficiencies?
  - If you have admission, CPE and PCC deficiencies (admission requirements), the student must be enrolled in the appropriate course their first year.
  - You are highly encouraged to take first semester.
