A Panel Discussion with Matt Kish, Denise Burge, Matt Hart, and Hollis Hammonds about feeding artistic obsession balanced with full and busy lives.

Matt Kish

A self-taught artist, illustrator, and set designer living in Ohio, Matt Kish works as a librarian by day and fills his time and the boundaries of found paper with personal responses to literary masterpieces. In 543 successive days, he illustrated each page of Mellville's Moby Dick and has since produced his own illustrated version of Joseph Conrad's Heart of Darkness.

Denise Burge

Professor of Art at the University of Cincinnati, Denise Burge teaches courses that range from seminars on film theory to fiber art. Her award-winning artistic practice continues to evolve along with her teaching and includes elements of video, installation, and works on quilts and paper.

Matt Hart

Chair of Liberal Arts at the Art Academy of Cincinnati with degrees in philosophy and poetry, Matt Hart is a poet, editor, and musician. His creative drive and diverse interests are illustrated in Forklift Ohio: A Journal of Poetry, Cooking, & Light Industrial Safety for which he is the founder and editor-in-chief.

Hollis Hammonds

Chair of the Department of Visual Studies at St. Edwards University in Austin, TX, Hollis Hammonds holds a BFA in Drawing from Northern Kentucky University and MFA from the University of Cincinnati. She combines drawing and found-objects into dystopian installations and is currently exhibiting in NKU's 3rd Floor Gallery.

Jen Delos Reyes is a creative laborer, educator, writer, and radical community arts organizer. Her practice is as much about working with institutions as it is about creating and supporting sustainable artist-led culture. Delos Reyes worked at Portland State University from 2008-2014 to create the first flexible residency Art and Social Practice MFA program in the United States and devised the curriculum that focused on place, engagement, and dialogue. During that time she also worked with the Portland Art Museum on a series of programs and integrated systems that allowed artists to rethink what can happen in a museum, and reinvigorate the idea of the museum as a public space.

She is the director and founder of Open Engagement, an artist-led initiative and conference committed to expanding the dialogue around and serving as a site of care for artists working within the complex social issues and struggles of our time. Delos Reyes is the author of *I'm Going to Live the Life I Sing About in My Song: How Artists Make and Live Lives of Meaning*, a book exploring the artist impetus toward art and everyday life. Her next book, Everything You Always Wanted to Know About Public Engagement But were Afraid to Ask, will be released in fall 2019.

Delos Reyes currently lives and works in Chicago, IL where she is the Associate Director of the School of Art and Art History at the University of Illinois Chicago.






