How to Determine Application Score for the NKU Nursing Application

- Your application score is made up of two parts: Your GPA & your grades in pre-requisite and other supporting courses.
- The NKU Nursing program will accept a cumulative GPA (sum of all college work) of a 3.0 or higher <u>OR</u> a GPA made up of the last 30 credit hours of college level work that is a 3.0 or higher.
- The following courses with qualifying grades are worth points toward your application score:

Course	A grade (A+ or A- counts the same)	B grade (B+ or B- counts the same)
STA 205 (or STA 212)	2	1
BIO 126	2	1
BIO 208/L	4	2
BIO 209/L	4	2
CHE 115/L	2	1
PSY 100	2	1
PSY 321 (or EDU 300)	2	1
Any credit received from CLEP test or AP test will receive full points for an A grade	Total: 18	Total: 9

To determine your score, start with your GPA (a 3.0 is worth 3 points, a 3.85 is worth 3.85 points, etc.) and add the points that correspond with the grades in the course that you have *already completed*. If you are in progress of any pre-requisite courses during your application cycle, they <u>WILL NOT</u> count toward points in your application score.

Example: Student A wants to determine their application score to see how competitive they are for the NKU Nursing program. They have a 3.14 cumulative GPA and the following grades in the pre-requisite courses: an A in BIO 126, an A- in BIO 208/L, an A in PSY 100, and a B+ in STA 205. This is how they would add up their score:

3.14 points + 2 points + 4 points + 2 points + 1 point = 12.14 points

Now you can use the point system to determine your application score!
