- 3. Copy of teaching certificate or out of state equivalent
- 4. Supplemental application demonstrating applicant's use of critical thinking, communication, creativity, and collaboration
- 5. Signed Codes of Ethics for Kentucky School Personnel and College of Education
- 6. Candidate will meet with advisor to determine how the selected courses will meet the Kentucky Teacher Standards.

Thirty (30) hours. If any courses have been previously taken then substitutions must be approved by candidate's advisor or program director.
