

Associate of Arts to Bachelor of Science in Sociology

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for the <u>Associate of Arts</u> degree at Gateway Community and Technical College and leads to the <u>Bachelor of Science in Sociology</u> degree at Northern Kentucky University.

Degree requirement for GCTC:

1) completion of minimum 60 credit hours, 2) minimum cumulative GPA 2.0, 3) minimum of 15 credit hours earned at the institution awarding the degree, 4) cultural studies course, and 5) demonstration of computer/digital literacy.

Degree requirements for a Bachelor of Science in Sociology:

To graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Sociology, a student must earn 36 credit hours in the major including one track. A grade of C or higher must be earned in the core courses and GPA of at least 2.00 must be earned in all courses that comprise the major. At least 45 credit hours must be 300 level or above. Students must meet the pre-requisites for each course. At least 20 percent of the total required hours must be taken at NKU.

This major can be completed face-to-face or online. If chosen to complete fully online, courses are offered in seven week formats. Please note that tuition for online accelerated programs differs from regular tuition and students in online accelerated programs are not eligible for any NKU scholarships.
