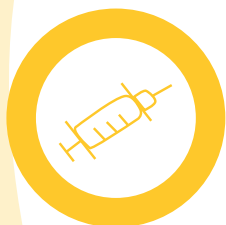

Respond to potential overdoses - and save a life.

Use of heroin or opioids, or drugs laced with these substances, increase the risk for overdose. If someone has overdosed, **FIRST CALL 911**. If you have been trained, perform CPR. Nalaxone (Narcan) can reverse an opioid overdose. If someone you know is at risk for an opioid overdose, you may want a nalaxone kit.
