AMERICAN ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAM (AELP)

The American English Language Program (AELP) at Northern Kentucky University offers English language classes in an Intensive Program, a Semi-Intensive Program or pre-arranged programs for groups.

For students who have not taken the TOEFL or IELTS exam or do not otherwise meet minimum English proficiency requirements, NKU offers the option to be conditionally admitted to the university after completing level VI of the Intensive English Program. Students enrolled in the advanced level of the Intensive English Program may be eligible for concurrent enrollment in both Intensive English classes and degree seeking courses. Students who successfully complete level VI of the Intensive English Program may be given special permission to enroll in a credit-bearing class along with the Intensive English coursework.

To apply for the Intensive or Semi-Intensive English Program, please complete the following requirements:

- 1. Application to American English Language Program
- 2. Application fee* of \$50.00 (USD) payable to NKU by check, money order, Visa, or MasterCard**
- **3.** Sponsor's original bank statement (only for students who are requesting a student visa).

4. Financial Certification from sponsor form (only for students who are requesting a student visa), which can be found at <u>https://inside.nku.edu/internationalstudents/forms.html</u>.

**NKU accepts credit card payment by phone, mail, or in-person upon arrival to Northern Kentucky University.

Admission to the American English Language Program is separate from admission to Northern Kentucky University. However, international students enrolled in the AELP are permitted to purchase housing and meals on campus and participate in the same extracurricular activities afforded to all NKU students. In general, if you are entering the US for the first time in F-1 or J-1 status, you must pay the SEVIS fee. Please visit <u>www.fmifee.com</u> to learn more about the SEVIS fee (in the amount of \$350), who needs to pay it, and payment options. This fee is in addition to and separate from the visa application fee paid to the US Embassy or Consulate. It must be paid before your application for a visa interview is granted.

<u>F-1 Student Transfers</u>: If you are currently in the United States in F-1 or J-1 student visa status and enrolled in another Intensive English Program, you must complete an NKU Transfer Form. This form must be completed by your current program advisor who will grant permission to release your SEVIS record to Northern Kentucky University. We cannot issue a new I-20 without your record being received by NKU from your current institution. This form can be found at https://inside.nku.edu/internationalstudents/forms.html.
