## OUR GOAL, OUR FOCUS: YOUR STUDENT'S SUCCESS

At NKU, we do all that we can to help students succeed. Sometimes students become overwhelmed with all they need to know. Students may not know what services are available to them or where to go to find those services. We see this most often as students make the transition from high school to college.

The Student Success Center is one example of an intentional effort to make it easier for students to find those services and programs they need to be successful at NKU.

Located in the University Center, the Student Success Center gives students an opportunity to simply walk in and ask their questions. They will find well-trained staff who are anxious to help.

On the second floor (entrance off of the plaza), **Norse Advising** advises many of our incoming students who aren't quite sure what they want to study. They work closely with **Career Services**, encouraging students to explore career options that fit their strengths and interests. While a lot of our students are very tech savvy, sometimes they need occasional help. They can find that assistance at the **Norse Tech Bar** where they can ask questions of our technology gurus.

The lower level of the Student Success Center also houses offices that are eager to help and support our students. **Learning PLUS** provides tutoring as well as a math and writing center. (The Writing Center is located on the third floor of Steely Library, while the math and tutoring centers are both located on the lower level of the University Center.) The office of **Testing Services** provides support for placement, NKU accommodated classroom exams, undergraduate admissions exams, as well as certification/

licensure. Within Testing Services is Adult Learning Programs and Services (ALPS), which is an adult accelerated education program taught by seasoned faculty and assists with campus resources. TRiO-Student Support Services provides academic, career and financial coaching for first-generation college students. **University** Connect and Persist (UCAP) provides one-onone guidance and support, and is home to a **Book Lending Library**. The Veterans Resource **Station** works to ensure a smooth transition for our student veterans. First-Year Programs provides students the opportunity to experience their first year of college in an environment that promotes active learning, collaboration and personal development.

The Student Success Center also houses the **Center for Global Engagement and International Affairs**. This office, located on the third floor, works with both international students who come to NKU as well as NKU students who have a desire to study abroad.

#### Health, Counseling and Student Wellness,

located on the fourth floor of the Student Success Center, is dedicated to helping students achieve and maintain optimal levels of physical, mental and emotional functioning.

Collectively, the staff and faculty at NKU are working together to support our students. The creation of the Student Success Center is just one of many examples.


