Happy Spring! The warmer weather in our region always bring a sense of optimism, and these positive feelings seem particularly strong this year. Our MPA program will move into amazing new space in the renovated Founders Hall in May, and Dr. Darrin Wilson will join us there in August, bringing his expertise in local government finance and economic development. In addition, the MPA faculty and Advisory Board unanimously agreed to adjust our admission requirements so that pre-career applicants – with less than 5 years of professional experience – can get a waiver on the GRE requirement if their undergraduate GPA is 3.0 or higher. Please share this modification with any coworkers, friends or family who are interested in the MPA degree but may have seen the GRE as a barrier.

On an institutional level, NKU has identified Ashish Vaidya as the new president, starting in July 2018. Dr. Vaidya has served as interim president at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota and, prior to that, as provost and vice president for academic affairs there. He has also held multiple leadership positions in the California State University system.

There will be continued growth on NKU's campus this year as the university celebrates its 50th anniversary. These developments include the Health Innovations Center – connected to Founders Hall – and a "gateway town center" at the corner of U.S. 27 and Nunn Drive.
