TRANSFER PATHWAY GUIDE 2024-2025

Associate in Applied Science in Nursing to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN to BSN)

Overview

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for the Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Nursing degree at Gateway Community and Technical College (GCTC) and leads to the RN and to the Bachelor of Science (BSN) degree in Nursing at Northern Kentucky University (NKU).

Applying to the Gateway2NKU Program

Students can apply to participate in the pathway program by completing the online application on the NKU transfer webpage. Students must be enrolled in at least six credit hours at Gateway, enrolled in an associate degree program, plan to transfer to NKU, and maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA at Gateway.

Degree Requirements for GCTC

1) Completion of minimum 60 credit hours, 2) minimum cumulative GPA 2.0, 3) minimum of 25 percent of credit hours required for the degree earned at the institution awarding the degree, 4) demonstration of digital literacy.

Program Pre-Requisites at Gateway include:

- 1) A grade of C or higher in all pre-requisite and co-requisite courses
- 2) 2.5 cumulative GPA in all pre-requisite and co-requisite courses
- 3) Completion of the NLN RN Pre-admission Exam (NLN PAX)
- 4) Active status on the Kentucky Nurse Aid Registry (must remain active until successful completion of NSG 101)
- 5) Current qualified CPR certification BLS (Basic Life Support) for the Healthcare Provider

To be considered for admission, applicants must comply with college and program admission requirements. Applications will be available in the fall semester for spring admission, and in the spring semester for fall admission. All pre-requisite courses must be completed at the time of application to the program.

Applications are ranked on a point system based on 1) GPA in pre/co-requisite courses, 2) BIO 137 grade, 3) MAT (or higher) grade, and 4) score on the NLN PAX. Additional points can be earned for

holding a prior degree or completing all co-requisite courses in advance. Points can be lost for unsuccessful attempt(s) in BIO 137 and/or the Quantitative Reasoning course (earning a D, E, F, or W).

BIO 137 (pre-requisite course) and BIO 139 (co-requisite course) expire five (5) years from the completion date of the course and must be retaken if expired by the start of NSG 101.

Admission Requirements to NKU

Students completing an associate degree with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher will be accepted into NKU.

Admission Requirements for the R.N. to B.S.N. program:

- Be fully admitted to NKU as a degree-seeking student.
- Submit a separate application to the R.N. to B.S.N. program.
- Submit to the Office of Admissions:
 - Official transcripts from an associate degree in nursing.
 - o Official transcripts from all postsecondary work completed.
- Possess a cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Complete the following prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of C in each course. Courses in parentheses are KCTCS courses.
 - o ENG 101 (ENG 101) and ENG 102 (ENG 102)
 - o BIO 208/208L (BIO 137) and BIO 209/209L (BIO 139)
 - o BIO 202/202L (BIO 225)
 - o PSY 100 (PSY 110)
 - o PSY 321 (PSY 223 or AHS 100) or EDU 300 (EDP 202)
 - PHI 220 (PHI 110) or PHI 200 (PHI 130)
- Hold current, unrestricted R.N. licensure within the first semester of admission to R.N. to B.S.N. program. Proof of R.N. licensure in state of practice is mandatory prior to enrollment in any nursing course.

This major can be completed online. Courses are offered in seven-week formats. Tuition for online accelerated programs differs from face-to-face tuition. Scholarship pricing is available to GCTC students who choose to enroll in the fully online program. Visit our website for more information about the Nursing Accelerated Online program.

Degree Requirements for NKU

To earn a bachelor's degree at NKU, students must complete a minimum of 120 credit hours with at least 45 credit hours numbered 300 and above. In addition, at least 25% of the credit hours required for the degree and the last 30 credit hours must be completed at NKU. Students must have an overall GPA of 2.0 and meet all prerequisites for courses and requirements for the major.

General Transfer Information

Students must complete the online application to NKU. There is no application fee for students who are transferring from Gateway.

Category 3: Additional Gateway Requirements for Core General Education Certification

In addition to completing the requirements of the AAS degree, students can complete additional courses from these categories in order to become Gen Ed Certified, a requirement at NKU. If a student

completes the AAS degree and transfers on to NKU without being Gen Ed certified, they will need to take six general education courses in addition to the required major courses.

National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN)

A requirement for admission to the RN to BSN program is an active registered nursing license. In order to obtain a nursing license nurses must take and pass the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN). Validation for passing the exam will be to verify a current license with the state board of nursing in which the student is licensed.

Students with an active registered nursing license will receive credit for NKU courses according to the chart below after they are enrolled in the R.N. to B.S.N. program.
