
On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women who had come with Je-sus from




Gal-i - lee came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had pre-pared. <sup>2</sup> They found the






these words seemed to them an i - dle tale, and they did not be-lieve them. 12 But Pe-ter
