
After this Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Gal-i-lee, also called the Sea of Ti-ber-i-




as. <sup>2</sup> A large crowd kept fol-low-ing him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the




sick. <sup>3</sup> Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his dis-ci-ples. <sup>4</sup> Now the Passover,




the festival of the Jews, was near. <sup>5</sup> When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward



him, Je-sus said to Phil-ip, “Where are we to buy bread for these peo-ple to eat?” <sup>6</sup> He said this




to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. <sup>7</sup> Philip answered him, “Six months’




wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a lit-tle.” <sup>8</sup> One of his dis-ci-ples,



An-drew, Si-mon Pe-ter’s broth-er, said to him, <sup>9</sup> “There is a boy here who has five barley




loaves and two fish. But what are they a-mong so man-y peo-ple?” <sup>10</sup> Je-sus said, “Make the




peo-ple sit down.” Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, a-bout




five thou-sand in all. <sup>11</sup> Then Je-sus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he dis-trib-




uted them to those who were seat-ed; so al-so the fish, as much as they want-ed. <sup>12</sup> When they




were sat-is - fied, he told his disciples, “Gath-er up the frag-ments left o - ver, so that nothing




may be lost.” <sup>13</sup> So they gath-ered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves,




left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve bas-kets. <sup>14</sup> When the people saw the sign that




he had done, they began to say, “This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world.” <sup>15</sup>




When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king,




he withdrew again to the mountain by him-self. **16** When evening came, his dis - ci - ples went




down to the sea, **17** got into a boat, and started across the sea to Ca-per-naum. It was now




dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. **18** The sea became rough because a strong wind was




blow-ing. **19** When they had rowed a-bout three or four miles, they saw Je-sus walk-ing on the




sea and com-ing near the boat, and they were ter-ri - fied. **20** But he said to them, "It is I;
