



Jesus left that place and came to his home-town, and his disciples fol-lowed him. ² On




the sabbath he be-gan to teach in the syn-a-gogue, and many who heard him were as-




tound-ed. They said, “Where did this man get all this? What is this wis-dom that has been




giv-en to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! ³ Is not this the car-




penter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are




not his sis-ters here with us?” And they took of-fense at him. ⁴ Then Jesus said to them,




“Pro-phets are not with-out hon-or, except in their hometown, and among their own kin,




and in their own house.” ⁵ And he could do no deed of pow-er there, except that he laid




his hands on a few sick people and cured them. ⁶ And he was amazed at their un-be-lief.




Then he went about among the villages teach-ing. 7 He called the twelve and be-gan to




send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spir-its. 8 He or-



dered them to take noth-ing for their jour-ney ex-cept a staff; no bread, no bag, no mon-




ey in their belts; 9 but to wear sandals and not to put on two tu-nics. 10 He said to them,




“Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. 11 If any place will not




welcome you and they re-fuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on
